

Students come from near, far to be a part of Peace

The first bell of the day rings at 8 a.m. now at Our Lady of Peace School. That's when the exciting buzz you can all remember fills the hallways as students make their way to their lockers and classrooms. Most of the students come from nearby



They come from all over Marshall County – Glen Dale, Moundsville, Washington Lands, and McMechen. Her students travel from as far south as New Martinsville and Proctor. They drive from the western communities of Dallas Pike and Cameron. They come from northern communities throughout Wheeling including Triadelphia and Valley Grove. Her students even travel across the River from St. Clairsville and Shadyside. More than 60 students travel 20 minutes or more to get to school. Several travel as much as an hour to get to school every day. So, why? Kerr said it is not due to a grand marketing plan. It is simply





because of reputation and focus.

"We work very hard as a faculty, school board, and parish to offer not only an excellent education, but also and arguably more importantly a nurturing, inspiring and

welcoming environment for every child," Kerr said. "We are always working on new and exciting curriculum; we are continually transforming our programs to stay in the lead; and we are standing firm on our foundation of faith and that will never change."

Our Lady of Peace School (OLP) serves children in grades Preschool 3 to 8th grade.

Eighth grader Jenna Cunningham, of St. Clairsville, wrote about how much she loves OLP in her book publishing assignment for her eighth grade English class. Cunningham transferred to the school when she was in fifth grade after her school, St. Joseph Central Grade School, closed its doors.

"I couldn't believe it. My school was closing? I was so sad and thought I would never have a school I could love again," she said. "My dad always taught me 'Everything happens for a reason'. He was right. I absolutely love Our Lady of Peace. There is so much to do here, and I have so many friends from all over.

"These have been the best four years of my life," she said. "I will be sad to leave, but (OLP) has prepared me well and I am confident I will do well the next four years."

Emma Brown of New Martinsville gets the prize for traveling the furthest distance to school.

"I literally have a school in my neighborhood I could walk to, but my parents heard about how nice Our Lady of Peace is and set up a day for me to visit," Brown, a sixth grader said. "I loved it. I remember

getting in the car with my mom after I shadowed, and Esteem for Ourselves and Others. begging her to please let me go to school here.

"I can't thank my parents enough for all the sacrifices they have to make for me to go here," she said. "I know they are happy. I'm doing better in school and I am so happy."

Proctor resident Justus Kirkland agrees with Brown

and added, "The teachers here care about you. They genuinely want you to do well. "It's not always easy to get up so early to get here on time, but it is worth it." Kirkland said.

Parent Tracy Sheedy of Cameron brings her threeyear-old son Nash to OLP, because she believes "the school is ahead of the others. Nash's PK3 class is doing lessons and activities that his peers in other schools who are in kindergarten haven't been challenged to do yet. If you ask Nash though, he'll just say 'I love school', he just wished it were every day." Our students in pre-school

through fifth grade are taught in an environment that recognizes the potential in each child, Kerr said. "Our culture of life-long learning provides positive reinforcement, self-confidence and guided instruction to build a desire for excellence and creativity." Our Lady of Peace is a two time National School of Tomorrow winner for innovations in education. "The faith formation of our students sets us apart," Kerr said. "We prepare our students not only for academic success, but to be leaders in the community by learning and leading others down Christ's path. We put our mission to practice. It's not just a bunch of words, we truly strive to be the People of PEACE: Prayer; Encouragement & Example; Academic Excellence; Community, Commitment, Covenant; and

"I really like having religion class and going to Mass as a whole school," said sixth grader Libby Murrin of Dallas Pike, "(OLP) is a great place to be. I can take advanced math with seventh grade. I know my teachers will work with me in all my subjects, because (OLP) has great student-teacher interaction. I appre-

ciate my parents for sending me and my brother (first grader) Jasper here." Fourth grader Alyssa Kalo of Triadelphia said she values OLP Pastor Fr. Dennis Schuelkens.

"Fr. Dennis is cool," she said. "He does so much for us at our school Masses, plays with us at recess, and comes into our classrooms. I can't imagine going to any other school. I can't imagine going to a school where we wouldn't pray as a class for someone who's sick or has died. It would be so weird not to have a Fr. Dennis or prayer in school."

The school offers activities for

students to enrich their mind and spirit, while developing honor and character.

"Our teams, clubs and activities foster responsibility, good will, dedication and hard work," Kerr said. "It's like our unofficial motto states, 'We work hard; we pray hard; and we play hard."

Students guided by their teachers discover their own passion for learning in and outside the typical classroom walls.

"I love my school," said the smiling fifth grader Lauren Tekely from St. Clairsville. "So does my mom, my dad, and my grandparents. There's always something fun going on or to work towards."

"We are the people of Peace," Kerr said.
